- Brigitte Artmann is councillor in the district of Wunsiedel in the Bavarian Fichtelgebirge. The speaker of the civil society movement STOPPT TEMELIN reports about the progress of the communication with the German Federal Environmental Ministry. The next meeting of the German/Czech Commission will be in October 2017 in North-Bohemia. The German Ministry was asked to demand an investigation based on the treaty between the both countries.

„Temelin and Tihange – Are there any differences?” - Jan Haverkamp today works at Wise Amsterdam. In 2000, he has revealed the case of the Temelin welding seam 1-4-5 (file 15/2001/SUJB) working for Greenpeace Czech Republic. Today he works at the case of Tihange. Jan Haverkamp is vice-chair of Nuclear Transparency Watch and adviser of Greenpeace.

„Temelin- Emergency preparedness in Passau”. Halo Saibold is councillor in the district of Passau and reports about the emergency preparedness situation of the Bavarian district which is closest to Temelin. The population will have to face evacuation if an accident will happen by east wind. Just to remember: When the nuclear accident took place at the NPP Fukushima the wind was mostly blowing from the west out to the Pacific Ocean.

From the region of the NPP Dukovany comes the Czech environmentalist Hana Konvalinková.

Please read the instructions from CEZ carefully!

Tour Date: 30.09.2017 – 09:00

Instructions:

1. Fill out all required details in the form.
2. Pay attention to the accuracy of the data you submit. If more than one character (digit/letter) in personal data of a visitor is incorrect, the visitor will not be allowed into the restricted area of Temelin NPP.
3. If any visitor has specific disabilities (prosthetic joint, insulin pump, implantable pacemaker or defibrillator, etc.), this must be stated in the form. Consequently, the visitor must present a medical certificate before entry into the restricted area. The same applies to any visitor who has been examined in the nuclear medicine department.

Attention:

- Persons under the age of 15 are not allowed to enter the restricted area of Temelin NPP.
- When being checked before entry to the restricted area, each visitor must present the exact identity document listed in the form (ID card or passport; for EU citizens a passport or identity document equivalent to an ID card)
- Persons under the influence of alcohol or addictive drugs are not allowed to enter the restricted area of Temelin NPP. If a visitor selected for random alcohol testing has a positive test result, the entire group will not be allowed into the restricted area of Temelin NPP.
- The following items are banned and should not be brought into the restricted area of Temelin NPP: arms (including knives, explosives,ammunition), alcohol, other addictive drugs, cameras, video cameras, mobile phones, bags, etc.
- Any visitor entering the restricted area of Temelin NPP is required to wear appropriate shoes - sturdy shoes with low heels are expected.
- The excursion is physically demanding (length of about 3 km, stairs and height elevation).
